

Legislative Recap: Week of February 4th

The 111th General Assembly is in full swing. Legislators met for floor sessions and committees this week. The deadline to file bills was February 6th in the House and February 7th in the Senate. More bills will begin moving through the legislative process starting next week. This session, legislators hope to improve the criminal justice and education systems, and seek legalization of sports betting and medical marijuana.

Governor Bill Lee's first legislative initiative calls for expanding access to vocational and technical training in Tennessee, which will be known as the Governor's Investment in Vocational Education (GIVE). The GIVE initiative is an approach that utilizes regional partnerships to develop work-based learning opportunities. It will also provide the opportunity for high school juniors and seniors to enroll in four fully-funded dual credit classes. In the past, students have only had access to two. GIVE Community Grants and GIVE Student Grants will fund the initiative.

Senator Janice Bowling also discussed her newly filed medical marijuana bill this week. The legislation does not permit any form of recreational marijuana use. It also does not require doctors and pharmacists to write and fill prescriptions for cannabis. This includes a system that requires patients to obtain a cannabis card from a doctor, PA or NP.

Requires THDA, for counties having a shortage of affordable rental housing, to set annual county income limits for the following year that qualify different sizes of low-income households for affordable rental housing and to set monthly rental rates that may be charged. Specifies that the monthly rental rates shall be based on the size of the rental unit and the income limit for the size of a low-income household. Requires THDA to provide the assessor of property in counties with a shortage of affordable rental housing and the state board of equalization with the applicable income limits and monthly rental rates. Requires the state board of equalization, in consultation with THDA, to create an application form for owners to use in applying to the assessor of property in a county in which there is a shortage of affordable rental housing for classification of rental housing as affordable rental property. Specifies other requirements for application process. Also specifies requirements for assessment of property that has been classified

as affordable rental property.

Declares the maximum vehicle length of a towaway trailer transporter combination to be 82 feet. Declares that a vehicle operated by an engine fueled primarily by natural gas must have a maximum

weight of 82,000 pounds.
